- Player Development Goals
 - Enhance player mastery of skills and techniques
 - Promote player awareness and insight into the game
 - Encourage a high level of player confidence
 - Build enthusiasm, passion, and continued love of game











- Group Practices
 - One day per week, all age groups
 - Practice session plans same each age group
 - Academy coaches alongside parent coaches
 - Consistency among teams
 - Same level of instruction and technique
 - Improved player evaluations

- Skills training
 - One day per week, all age groups
 - Fundamental soccer skills
 - Attacking, defending and transitioning
 - Playing under pressure
 - Goalkeeping

Small-Sided Games

- 3v3, 4v4, 7v7, 9v9 (game "like", flexible)
- Why
 - Fewer players and smaller fields result in more touches
 - More touches result in improved skills and more decisions
 - More decisions result in more chances for learning and development
 - More chances for learning and development lead to improved confidence and comfort with/without the ball
 - Improved confidence results in less stress and more fun

- Complete referee evaluation

Reminders

- Respect referees at all times (zero tolerance)
- Leave room for referees to travel sidelines
- Referees will verify credentials
- No coaches on sideline without a credential
- Parents cannot substitute without a credential











Code of Conduct

Highlights

- Agreed to at time of registration
- Respect all opposing parents, players and coaches
- Respect all referees
- Promote good sportsmanship
- Zero tolerance

- Players have fun and develop a love of the game
- Coaches and parents focus on player development

 - Players improve understanding of the game
 - Players learn teamwork and the value of hard work
